How to make, or update, your Will.



Do you have a valid Will that reflects your changed circumstances?

Maybe you've sold a home, a business, retired, lost a loved one, remarried, or made other major changes to your life situation. It's so important that you make or update your Will. And it's so easy to make sure that your Will is going to Let Grace Flow to the needy for generations to come. How? Simply by including a bequest in your Will to Anglican Aid.

A bequest is a deferred gift that is written into your Will. (It costs you nothing now.) It can be a gift of cash, property shares or other investments. By leaving a gift to Anglican Aid in your Will, you can leave a lasting impact for the Gospel and on people living in poverty for many years to come.

By supporting Anglican Aid projects, your gift can help to train the next generation of Christian leaders in the developing world and address poverty and injustice in our world, and in turn show the compassion and justice of God to those in need.

Make a long lasting gift that will impact Anglican Aid through its three funds:

Overseas Development

All our Overseas Development projects are run in partnership with Christian agencies that have a track record for delivering real change. We actively look for projects that bring practical help to people who are disadvantaged by poverty, disease, disability and illiteracy. We've seen joy spread to countless people in India, The Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Egypt, Kenya, Tanzania, and Uganda. Projects include: nutrition and food security; malaria reduction programs; providing education on HIV/AIDS; working with disabled children and their communities and education. This fund is tax-deductible.

Overseas Ministry

Overseas Ministry is especially supportive of Anglican churches across Africa who believe in the gospel of grace. To be as practical as possible, we focus on delivering financial support for Bible training, and providing materials and equipment. Churches in Africa and other parts of the developing world are growing and leaders desperately want training. In most cases neither the church nor the individuals themselves have the resources to pay for training or the means of support while they are in training. We have been able to support a number of men and women in training for ministry in places such as Kenya, South Africa, Egypt, Tanzania, The Democratic Republic of Congo and Mauritius. This fund is not tax-deductible.

Community Care

Community Care projects are scattered right across the inner city to the outer suburbs of the Sydney Diocese. Community Care funds activities that use local Anglican churches as a base for practical help. It takes the form of assisting the outcast, befriending the lonely and giving a helping hand to those who have experienced hardship. This fund is tax-deductible.

The impact of your legacy

How to leave a bequest to Anglican Aid

Whether you have a will or not, here are the steps you need to follow to include us in your will. You can leave an amount to Anglican Aid or you can specify which of the three funds you would like your bequest to go to. If you would like your bequest to be tax-deductible, please specify one of our tax-deductible funds.

If you are writing a new Will You have three choices:

1. Leaving us the residue of your estate (anything left over after you have met all your personal commitments)
2. Leaving us a percentage of your estate
3. Leaving us a specific amount

If you have an existing Will

You can easily update it with an additional clause that includes your bequest, and complies with all the requirements of a valid will. Your solicitor will provide you with the appropriate documentation.

Obtain legal advice

We recommend that whether you're thinking of making a new Will, or updating an existing Will, you seek qualified legal advice. They will make sure your Will is valid and that your intentions are clearly and legally stated.

An example of the legal language requirements for your will

"I give, free of all duties and taxes: the whole of my estate, or ___% or residue of my estate (or ___% of the residue of my estate or the amount of \$___), to The Archbishop of Sydney's Anglican Aid (ABN 28 525 237 517) for its general purposes and I direct that the signed receipt of the Director of the said body shall be a full and sufficient discharge for my executors."
