

HOW WE WORK

Anglican Aid is a charity registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC), and is accredited by the Christian Management Australia's Standards Council. As a Public Benevolent Institution (PBI), Anglican Aid supports activities in Australia and overseas.

All donations to Anglican Aid are tax-deductible. Internationally, Anglican Aid often works with low capacity partners, supporting small projects that the local community has identified as necessary and urgent. We are involved with a wide range of health, education, income generation, and other capacity-building initiatives. Anglican Aid works with Christian churches and organisations, often within the GAFCON or Global South Anglican networks, and where we have a personal, trusted connection. This reduces the overhead costs of establishing local delivery agencies, as faithful churches exist in most geographic areas of the work we support.

ANGLICAN AID IS ALSO THE TRUSTEE OF TWO FUNDS:

THE OVERSEAS RELIEF AND AID FUND

The Overseas Relief and Aid Fund (ORAF) supports longer term development projects which meet the Overseas Aid Gift Deduction Scheme criteria. These projects assist in empowering and building the capacity of local communities to create sustainable change. ORAF is a registered charity with the ACNC.

THE OVERSEAS MINISTRY FUND

The Overseas Ministry Fund supports ministries in places where strong Bible training is limited and under-resourced, by providing financial support for evangelistic activities and theological training. In doing so, we support the next generation of gospel workers so that the grace of Jesus Christ will be known more widely in the developing world. As a Basic Religious Charity, registered with the ACNC, donations to the Overseas Ministry Fund are not tax-deductible.

The OMF has been approved by the Australian Taxation Office to operate a School Building Fund (SBF). This fund is eligible to receive tax-deductible donations to support capital works at theological colleges.

FROM OUR CHAIRMAN



DEAR FRIENDS,

Thank you for supporting Anglican Aid. Through Anglican Aid we, in the Diocese of Sydney and across Australia, have worked together to see churches strengthened and communities transformed around the world.

We praise God for the growth in Anglican Aid and that in this financial year, for the first time, our income has reached 8 million dollars. This growth has been across all our programs and much of this growth is from increased donations by churches and individuals.

In January 2022, we saw a significant change in the focus of Anglican Aid as we handed over the Australian based 'Community Care' programs to Anglicare. As a result, Anglican Aid has positioned itself to concentrate on international work. We are now the largest Anglican 'Aid and Ministry Support agency' in Australia and one of the largest worldwide.

The relaxation of Covid travel restrictions has enabled the Anglican Aid team to make some significant visits to international partners in the first half of 2022. Visits to DR Congo, South Sudan, Tanzania, Seychelles and Madagascar have enabled staff to build relationships and to take an active part in developing our holistic partnerships. Through the Bible College Student Sponsorship program and grants to Bible Colleges, leaders for the churches are raised up and trained. Alongside this work of strengthening the

church through theological education, Anglican Aid enables churches to minister to their own local communities through both emergency and development aid projects.

At the end of April, Tim Swan (CEO), Chris Cooper (Theological Education Director) and I (International Bishop for Sydney Diocese) travelled to northeast Congo to participate in the first national conference on the future of theological education in the Anglican Church of Congo. The funding for theological education across Congo and the conference itself is provided through Anglican Aid. Chaired by the recently appointed Archbishop of Congo and with the majority of the bishops and Bible college principals from the Anglican Church of Congo in attendance, the conference laid the foundation and put plans in place for the implementation of Bible-based, evangelical training for gospel workers into the future.

Anglican Aid has also sent emergency relief to help the church care for those fleeing internal conflict within Congo, and is involved in a significant project to strengthen schools run by the Anglican Church.

Thank you once again for your support. Can I urge you to continue your support of churches and communities around the world through prayer and sacrificial giving so that the vital work of Anglican Aid can continue to the glory of our Lord Jesus.





FROM OUR CEO SHOWING CHRIST, EXPLAINING CHRIST

This year I had the privilege of visiting Madagascar and meeting up with Rev Berthier Lainirina who was able to show me how aid, development, gospel proclamation and theological training work together in his diocese, supported by your generous gifts to Anglican Aid. He took me to some of the many churches that have been planted as the gospel was proclaimed following food distribution in response to a famine and drought over a year ago.

"Because of the love we showed through food distribution and clean water and other social works, the church is growing," said Rev Berthier. "So we would like to thank Anglican Aid and the Diocese of Sydney for giving us that support."

It was a joy to meet some of the hundreds of people who have turned to Jesus as a result of this work. I was also able to meet Bible college students who are being trained to lead churches through the support of generous Anglican Aid Bible college sponsors and see some of the water projects funded by Anglican Aid that will help to build the communities' resilience against drought and reduce water-borne disease.

My visit to Madagascar was one of three trips to Africa this year to meet some of our key partners. Due to COVID restrictions, these were the first visits I have been able to make since commencing as CEO back in April 2020. I saw first-hand the schools, vocational training colleges, water projects, and agricultural projects supported by your gifts to Anglican Aid. I also participated in a Theological Education conference with bishops and principals, and visited eight Bible Colleges where some students are sponsored by Anglican Aid supporters.

THE NEEDIEST PLACES

My visits to Africa this year helped me to understand what is happening on the ground, and informed the direction of our 2022-26 Strategic Plan, now finalised. One important strategic decision made together by the board and senior staff, was to concentrate our efforts on supporting communities and partners living in the neediest places in the world, where churches are confronting the greatest persecution and/or poverty, and where theological education is particularly lacking. This has led us to engage more deeply with priority partners in Tanzania, DR Congo, Madagascar, South Sudan, and the Nuba Mountains region in Sudan.

We are committed to providing holistic support to our partners in these places. For us, this means pairing immediate aid with long-term development and building up the local church through training church leaders.

NEW PROGRAMS, NEW PEOPLE

Anglican Aid has experienced significant growth in income during the 2021-22 financial year. This has allowed us to invest more in overseas projects, including starting many new projects and being better equipped to respond to natural disasters. We have also invested in our systems and staff, developing stronger channels of communication with our supporters as we build relationships here and overseas.

This year, Anglican Aid launched a series of new programs - the foremost of which is the Persecuted Christians Support Program. With prayer and financial support from believers in Australia, Anglican Aid has been able to send emergency relief to beloved brothers and sisters suffering violent attacks because of their faith.

We have also progressed the new Developing Countries Education Program which brings together education projects ranging from preschool to tertiary courses; the new School Building Fund which supports capital works for Bible colleges; and opened tax-deductible opportunities to support Bible college students from developing countries.

To support our expanded work in theological education overseas, Anglican Aid welcomed Dr Chris Cooper as Director of Theological Education, and also appointed Michael Charles and Rev Samuel Majok to this team.

We also farewelled the long-serving and indefatigable Eddie Ozols, who served as Operations Manager of Anglican Aid for nine years. His contributions to our mission are innumerable. His successor, Margo Leach, is ably continuing this work. We also farewelled Virginia Lee, our Donor Relations Officer and Aiden McCorkindale who was replaced by Cameron Jansen as Senior Manager of Projects. We will miss Virginia and Aiden's wisdom, skills and grace as they carried out their work.

I thank God for his hand of blessing over Anglican Aid, our board, staff, and supporters. It has been an absolute privilege to serve as CEO and to see the grace of God overflowing to a world in need.

BIBLE COLLEGE STUDENT SPONSORSHIPS: EQUIPPING THE NEXT GENERATION OF LEADERS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

BISHOPS AND CHRISTIAN LEADERS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES ARE SEEKING HELP TO EQUIP THEIR PEOPLE TO TEACH THE BIBLE.

In 2020, Anglican Aid launched its Bible College Student Sponsorship Program, which enables Australian Christians to support Bible college students with financial support for their studies, prayer and encouragement. These students have been recommended by their local church pastor and bishop for their godly character and leadership potential. They come from many nations across Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Pacific.

Generous Australian sponsors are currently enabling 180 Bible college students to receive culturally relevant training at trusted Bible colleges. There are also over 300 students being supported to undertake short courses such as the Moore College Preliminary Theological Certificate.

MADAGASCAR: PTC TRAINING IN MALAGASY

The Anglican Church of Madagascar longs to see more of their people receive Bible training to lead gospel ministries. To this end, the Centre for Global Mission with Rev Berthier Lainirina is translating Moore College Preliminary Theological Certificate (PTC) subjects into the local language, Malagasy. Seven subjects have been translated so far.

"The Malagasy translation is important so Malagasy people have books and materials to help them understand the word of God," said Rev Berthier Lainirina, Principal of St Patrick's Theological College, Toliara.

Anglican Aid is supporting 25 students from five dioceses to study the PTC in Malagasy. We are assisting with accommodation and travel costs for lecturers and students to attend six, week-long training events over two years. The Malagasy PTC materials are also being used at St Patrick's and in the six Madagascar dioceses.

Anglican Aid has also been supporting the Anglican Church of Madagascar's water projects, famine relief and MegaVoice audio Bible distribution.

HUMANITARIAN AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

ANGLICAN AID PROVIDES EMERGENCY RELIEF TO COMMUNITIES DEVASTATED BY NATURAL DISASTERS, HEALTH EMERGENCIES AND WAR. WE WORK WITH TRUSTED CHRISTIAN ORGANISATIONS AND LOCAL CHURCHES WHO ARE DEEPLY INVOLVED IN THESE COMMUNITIES. THIS CREATES MEANINGFUL AND ONGOING RELATIONSHIPS.

TONGA: \$148,000

In January 2022, Anglican Aid launched an appeal for Tonga following the Hunga Tonga-Hunga Ha'apai underwater volcano eruption. The ash falls and tsunamis which followed caused widespread devastation of crops, water infrastructure, housing and roads. In partnership with Missions New Zealand, The Anglican Diocese of Polynesia and Anglican Relief and Development Fund, money was given to provide food, water, medical and other emergency supplies.

CYCLONE ANA: \$21,000

In January 2022, Cyclone Ana struck southeast Africa, destroying buildings and infrastructure throughout Madagascar, Malawi and Mozambique. Two weeks later, Cyclone Batsirai hit Madagascar, causing further devastation. Generous donors gave to an Anglican Aid appeal to provide funds for immediate relief including food, water, medical supplies, farming inputs, household items and mosquito nets, through Anglican churches in these countries.

RESETTLING AFGHAN REFUGEES: \$165,000

In August 2021, the world watched in horror as the Taliban took over Afghanistan. In October, Anglican Aid launched an appeal to help resettle Christian Afghan refugees in Brazil, under the care of Anglican Aid's long-term partner Sammy Nagib, and the Diocese of Vitoria.





KENYA: MARSABIT AID FOR INTERNALLY DISPLACED PEOPLE

In August 2021, tribal conflict in Marsabit, northern Kenya drove 570 households to flee their homes. Anglican Aid launched an appeal and provided \$65,000 for food relief for internally displaced people in Marsabit.

GIVING PHYSICAL AND SPIRITUAL FOOD

Alongside providing food relief, the Anglican Church ran a mission to internally displaced people in Marsabit.

INDONESIA: PROJEK BALI FAMILIES

In Singajara, Widya Asih runs Projek Bali Families, providing family-based educational support, lifeskills, meals, school uniforms and stationery for families living in poverty. A ministry of the Christian Protestant Church of Bali, it shows Christ's love to children who wouldn't otherwise easily access education.



"I want my children to be at the highest level of education... because I realise life is very difficult if you don't have a high educational background. By joining them in this program, I am happy that they spend positive time studying,

ANGLICAN AID'S EDUCATION PROJECTS PROVIDE IMPOVERISHED CHILDREN WITH SAFE SPACES TO LEARN AND GROW.

LEBANON: GOOD SHEPHERD SCHOOL

Reem and her husband Emil started Good Shepherd School in 2014 to educate children from the many Syrian refugee families who were living in tents near their home in the north of Lebanon. They now teach more than 350 students.

Reem and Emil are seeing dramatic changes in the hearts and minds of the children. Many start at the school lacking confidence, rarely smiling, and showing aggression towards each other.

"I am constantly filled with joy seeing the big difference in their attitudes towards each other and towards their teachers, their ability to learn, and especially the joy - the transformation of their faces from sad to hopeful," said Reem. "And I believe that the deepest reason for this transformation resides in the fact that they realised that God is not an angry God, but a loving father. They experience this reality through the way the teachers and all the staff treat them."

RAHAF'S STORY

"My family and I left Syria because of the war. We now live close to the school. Our house was bombed and so we had nothing left in Syria. Father Emil and his wife Reem came to visit us. God bless them. When they visited us we were working in the fields. They invited us to the school and showed us the light. I did not have any education and so they gave us the opportunity to learn and to excel."

PAKISTAN: VICTORIA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

In partnership with One2Another, Anglican Aid is supporting Victoria Memorial Hospital. The hospital was established in March 2021 to provide affordable, quality health care to poor and marginalised people in Multan, Pakistan. The Christian staff begin their work day in prayer and Bible reading and serve as a witness to Christ's love.

In November 2021, an eye-care department was established at the hospital and since then it has helped over 700 patients, including 50 cataract surgeries.

RESTORING SIGHT

Wilson Bhatti heard about Victoria Memorial Hospital through his church. The 66-year-old had a business creating marble pots and gravestones and his left eye had been damaged by marble dust in the course of his work. Unable to work and with no income, he was struggling to support his family. He sought help at the Victoria Memorial Hospital's new eye clinic. After successful surgery, he is now able to work again. He is extremely grateful to God to have his sight back, and to One2Another for providing affordable, quality care.



Its camps are a great blessing to families whose day-to-day existence can be lonely and difficult.

Timion changes lives as parents build friendships and encounter Christian fellowship and teaching.







INCOME GENERATION: RELIABLE INCOME FOR PASTORS

ANGLICAN AID SUPPORTS PROJECTS THAT EQUIP PEOPLE IN POOR COMMUNITIES WITH SKILLS THAT BRING RELIABLE INCOME. WE SUPPORT ACTIVITIES LIKE AGRICULTURAL TRAINING, APPRENTICESHIP WORKSHOPS, AND SMALL BUSINESS LOANS.

ZIMBABWE: HONEYWORLD

Honeyworld empowers local farmers to build sustainable honey-making businesses. It provides training, equipment, initial capital and ongoing support to harvest and sell honey. Its particular focus is helping pastors to generate an income through bee-keeping.

In 2022, Honeyworld is working with 70 beekeepers in local villages and has supplied more than 150 hives. Honeyworld bought 5.5 tonnes of honey from their farmers this year, up from 300kg when they started in 2019. It then sells the honey to local and regional markets, passing on the income to the farmers.

GIVE THANKS

Praise God that Honeyworld is providing an income for pastors and villagers in Zimbabwe.

Rev Munjuwanjuwa is a pastor who has been keeping bees since he was a boy. He was only selling a few jars of honey in his village before he completed training with Honeyworld. Now he has five additional hives, which has substantially increased his output and is providing him with regular income to support his ministry.

As well as providing a place of refuge for women, healthcare, accommodation and advocacy, the project connects women with skills-based workshops and peer support to provide better work alternatives.

PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS SUPPORT

ANGLICAN AID LAUNCHED ITS PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS SUPPORT PROGRAM AT EASTER 2022, PROVIDING PRAYER, ADVOCACY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO CHRISTIANS SUFFERING PERSECUTION IN AFRICA, SOUTH ASIA AND THE MIDDLE EAST.

NIGERIA: SUPPORTING PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS

In 2021, over 5,000 Christians in Nigeria lost their lives at the hands of Islamic groups Boko Haram, Fulani militants and Islamic State West Africa Province. In north and central Nigeria, over 10,000 people were displaced in these attacks.

In Plateau and southern Kaduna, which were the epicentre of the Fulani Islamist militia attacks, more than 100,000 people were displaced in over 150 villages that suffered devastating attacks.

In partnership with the Diocese of Jos, Anglican Aid has provided maize and beans to over 20 villages, impacting 12,500 people, predominantly women and children. Zinc roofing sheets have been supplied for rebuilding homes that have been damaged, providing shelter for about 7,000 people.

"I have had the confidence to stand in front of the congregation in church and proclaim the love of Christ as demonstrated by our brothers and sisters abroad through Anglican Aid. How else could I have told them that Jesus cares and how could God have proven his love but through the demonstration of the help, the food and these roofing sheets coming from people we do not know and have never met?"

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

This year income and expenditure is presented for our three funds combined, to reflect the way that our three entities work together to support the ministry of our partners around the world.

The aggregate income for all funds administered by Anglican Aid for the year ended June 2022 was \$8,069,671. This is a 36% increase in total income from the previous financial year. We praise God for the faithful generosity of his people for this wonderful result!


Important contributors to this increase in income are the ongoing growth of our Bible College Students Sponsorship program, growth of our long-term development projects portfolio, significant donations from a number of major donors towards long-term development projects and gospel ministry, and the generous response of many donors to emergencies, particularly the disaster in Tonga.

Notable changes to sources of income during the year were the School Building Fund operating to enable Bible college construction, reduced income from government grants as COVID-19 impacts recede, and the transition of management of the Australian Community Care Program from Anglican Aid to Anglicare on 1 January 2022. A significant portion of income, 14%, was received in the form of non tax-deductible donations which are used for overseas gospel ministry.


Total funds expended on projects, including project management costs, was \$6,552,675, meaning that 81% of all expenditure went towards our projects and partners. \$981,772 or 12% of expenditure was used for accountability, fundraising and administration, while a small amount of funds, \$535,224 or 7% of funds, remain in reserve for new projects and initiatives to build the future capacity of Anglican Aid.


Our largest project sector, using 46% of all expenditure, is education and training, reflecting our programs in community leadership training, Bible College Student Sponsorships, and the Developing Countries Education Program. We continue to fund long-term development projects in diverse sectors including WASH and food security, and respond to emergencies as required, with these two areas comprising 21% of all expenditure.
