The Diocese of Gitega's Food Security Project has provided training to help Joel increase crop yields. He has also been able to purchase a new plot of one hectare through his increased crop income and access to a small loan from the diocese' saving and loan initiative.

He has now planted a nursery with fruit and eucalyptus trees to provide food for his family and protect his land from erosion. He said, "My heart is full of joy and gratitude to God and Anglican Aid. For me, this is the love of God in its purest form, that (you) provided funds for this project without even personally knowing us."

HOW WE WORK

LOCAL PARTNERS

Anglican Aid often works with low capacity partners, supporting small projects that the local community has identified as necessary and urgent.

LOCAL CHRISTIANS

Anglican Aid works with local Christian churches and organisations, often within the GAFCON or Global South Anglican networks, and where we have a personal, trusted connection. This reduces the overhead costs of establishing local delivery agencies, as faithful churches exist in most areas where our projects are located.

A REGISTERED CHARITY

Anglican Aid is a charity, registered with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).

ANGLICAN AID IS ALSO THE TRUSTEE OF TWO FUNDS:

THE OVERSEAS RELIEF AND AID FUND

The Overseas Relief and Aid Fund (ORAF) supports longer term development projects which meet the Overseas Aid Gift Deduction Scheme criteria. These projects assist in empowering and building the capacity of local communities to create sustainable change. ORAF is a registered charity with the ACNC.

THE OVERSEAS MINISTRY FUND

The Overseas Ministry Fund (OMF) supports ministries in places where strong Bible training is limited and under-resourced, by providing financial support for evangelistic activities and theological training. Through this fund, we are equipping gospel workers to strengthen churches.

As a Basic Religious Charity, registered with the ACNC, donations to the Overseas Ministry Fund are not tax-deductible.

The OMF has been approved by the Australian Taxation Office to operate a School Building Fund. This fund is eligible to receive tax-deductible donations to support capital works at theological colleges. ANGLICAN AID IS THE OVERSEAS AID, DEVELOPMENT AND MINISTRY SUPPORT AGENCY OF SYDNEY ANGLICANS IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE GLOBAL CHURCH.

Welcome to this year's Annual Report from Anglican Aid. Once again we are eager to report to you about the way God has been working to strengthen churches and transform communities by your generosity through Anglican Aid.

Anglican Aid is the aid, development and ministry support agency of the Diocese of Sydney. But whether you are an Anglican from Sydney or a supporter from much further afield, you can be confident that Anglican Aid is committed to the transforming gospel of Jesus Christ. With each partnership we have around the world, we pray that a relationship with Anglican Aid will leave our partners and their people trusting Jesus more and increasingly committed to the teaching of his unchanging word.

Anglican Aid has grown quite dramatically over the past few years. In the financial year 22-23, for the first time Anglican Aid's income has passed 11 million dollars. That means that the giving of God's people to Anglican Aid has almost doubled in just two years. We praise God that this dramatic increase in the size of Anglican Aid means that more people are helped - more transformed lives, more transformed churches and more transformed communities.

The dramatic growth of Anglican Aid also means that the management and governance of Anglican Aid must keep pace with these changes. Our CEO, the Rev Canon Tim Swan, continues to build a strong and competent team. As chair, I would like to thank Tim and his team for the passion and professionalism that they bring. I would also like to thank our Board, those elected by the Synod or appointed by the Archbishop, who strive to keep the governance of Anglican Aid at the highest level. Anglican Aid is uniquely placed to be the agency of choice for evangelical Christians who wish to see the gospel at work in less resourced churches and their communities. Anglican Aid's holistic approach couples church leadership development, through theological education, and the work of aid and development through these strengthened churches, ministering to their own communities. Through this approach we are seeing gospel growth as well as the alleviation of poverty in places like Tanzania, Madagascar, Congo and Pakistan.

Please continue to support Anglican Aid so that God's grace might flow to those in both spiritual and physical need in the poorest communities. We covet your prayers and your ongoing financial support, all for the glory of our Lord Jesus and the growth of his Kingdom.

FROM OUR CEO - THANK YOU FOR BEARING THEIR BURDENS



"BEAR ONE ANOTHER'S BURDENS, AND SO FULFIL THE LAW OF CHRIST." (GALATIANS 6:2)

On behalf of the staff at Anglican Aid, I want to say thank you. Thank you for helping bear the burdens of poorer Christians around the world

by sending support through Anglican Aid.

Thank you for helping shoulder the burden of those who are reaching out with the love of Christ to those affected by natural disasters: together we have helped after earthquakes in Syria, cyclones in Madagascar and Mozambique, floods in Pakistan, and deadly droughts in Ethiopia and Kenya.

We thank God that giving to Anglican Aid has increased by more than a third each year over the last two years, with supporter numbers increasing from 3,090 giving last year, to 3,800 giving this year, meaning that together we are helping lift the burdens of more and more people in the neediest communities, fulfilling the law of Christ.

A personal highlight this year was attending the GAFCON conference in Rwanda, alongside Anglican leaders from over 50 countries. Anglican Aid works in 37 of the poorest nations, and it was humbling to meet with many of our partners, pray with them, and hear their tremendous appreciation for the support coming from Australian Christians living on the other side of the world. It is a beautiful expression of the love of Christ. Anglican Aid staff have visited partners in 14 countries this year, and we are always stunned with how much is achieved with minimal resources - your support truly goes a long way!

EFFECTIVE USE OF YOUR MONEY

Since the Lord calls us to be wise stewards of the money he entrusts to us (cf. Luke 19), we have high levels of accountability for any money we send, and we make sure any funds are used as effectively as possible. This is how we are able to support 271 full time Bible College students, leading to multiple flow-on effects that will last for generations, indeed for eternity! On p 31 you can see that we invest 13% in fundraising and administrative support. This is not 'lost money': we have leveraged this to grow our support base and almost double our income over

the last two years, meaning more people are praying for the church around the world, more people are in partnership giving, and more people are being helped - a worthwhile investment! We also invest in streamlining our systems, while maintaining the highest standards. Along with our regular financial audit, this year Anglican Aid was audited by the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC), with no recommendations being made. We were among around only 15% of charities which were found to have no compliance issues!

GROWTH IN THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION

Anglican Aid aims to increase access to context appropriate biblically-based theological education, particularly amongst the poorest 200 dioceses of the Anglican Communion. This work grows apace, with the addition of Judith Calf to our team (bringing 35 years of Bible college experience as a missionary with CMS). In April, our team ran a conference looking at the future of theological education in the Anglican Church of Tanzania, attended by 22 bishops and 10 Bible college principals. As well as sponsoring students, training lecturers and working on curriculum, Anglican Aid has built additional classrooms in Tanzania and Madagascar, to help train more workers for gospel ministry, and is continuing to support construction in colleges across Tanzania, South Sudan, DRC and Madagascar.

NEW AUSTRALIAN PARTNERSHIPS

The Diocese of Canberra-Goulburn is partnering with Anglican Aid to support the Diocese of Jos in Nigeria, helping train ministers, educate children and support the dispossessed in an area where Christians suffer extreme levels of persecution.

We are also partnering with Ministry Training Strategy Australia (MTS) to help with the overseas side of multiplying gospel workers through ministry apprenticeships.

We appreciate the confidence all our partners and supporters place in Anglican Aid as we work together to see the grace of God overflowing to a world in need.

FROM OUR PRESIDENT

It was an immense privilege, on behalf of the Diocese of Sydney, to visit several of Anglican Aid's projects in north-eastern Tanzania, in the Dioceses of Tarime, Rorya and Mara in April this year.

In the Diocese of Mara, I accompanied Bishop George Okoth and Canon Helen Hoskins for the opening of the Shalom Primary School, with whom Anglican Aid has been involved for some time, installing a well in 2017 and providing funds for construction since then.

In addition to unveiling a foundation stone, I was invited to dedicate the Canon Helen Hoskins Memorial Hall, the building of which, along with classrooms, library and dormitories, was made possible through the generosity of Anglican Aid donors and Anglican Aid's partner, the Grace and Mercy Foundation. The dedication ceremony was marked by presentations from every year group of the school, as well as speeches by the outstanding Principal, Madam Joyce, the Bishop and Canon Helen, as well as local (and visiting) dignitaries. There is no doubt in my mind that the Shalom Primary School is not only providing an excellent education in a Christian environment to the 600 or so enrolled children in the school, but is creating the possibility of entirely different, more secure and flourishing futures for these children. It is both humbling and breathtaking to reflect upon.

Also in the Diocese of Mara, I was able to visit Bunda Bible College (BBC) currently hosting around 70 students, including some from other African nations. Anglican Aid has a relationship with BBC dating back more than a decade, and most recently has contributed to the building of new classrooms and toilet facilities for the staff and students, all of whom live on campus. Nearly 60 of the students are sponsored by Anglican Aid supporters. They are all training for ministry as pastors, evangelists, youth workers and church planters. Thank you for making this investment in church growth and health by supporting these faithful and joyful young servants of the Lord.

THANKING GOD FOR JOY

EARLY THIS YEAR, I WAS HUMBLED TO LEARN THAT A CHRISTIAN NURSE IN SYDNEY WHO DIED AT THE AGE OF 93, LEFT A SIGNIFICANT GIFT IN HER WILL TO ANGLICAN AID.

I was deeply encouraged to hear about Joy's life. One of Joy's friends, and the executor of her Will, told me that Joy had been a nurse for over 50 years and loved Jesus, serving him wholeheartedly. She was active in her church, leading Bible studies, singing in the choir and being ready to do whatever was needed. She loved people and was incredibly hospitable, often hosting meals and meetings in her home.

Joy and her good friend Sue, also a nurse and a Christian, earned modest wages but they carefully invested small amounts in the stock market over a long period of time. Joy would sometimes sell shares to quietly give money to church or charities. She also lived simply. At the time of her death she'd accumulated a substantial amount, which she was able to generously leave as a legacy for future generations.

When I asked why Joy had chosen to remember Anglican Aid in her Will, her friend shared that

Joy and Sue had travelled and nursed in countries where healthcare was under-resourced and they were acutely aware of the problems this caused. As a nurse, Joy wanted to care for people's physical health but as a Christian, she also wanted to provide for people's spiritual health. Joy's friend said, "Joy wanted the gospel to go to as many people as possible."

Joy felt that many organisations only address physical needs and she saw Anglican Aid as an organisation that addressed both spiritual and physical wellbeing.

I am grateful that Joy entrusted this money to Anglican Aid to allow us to share God's love in practical ways with people in need as well as pointing them to the eternal hope we find in Jesus.

DO YOU HAVE DONKEYS?

THIS YEAR A GROUP FROM SYDNEY DIOCESE VISITED PROJECTS IN TANZANIA SUPPORTED BY ANGLICAN AID. JODIE MCNEILL SHARED HIS EXPERIENCE.

During our ministry trip to Tanzania, I had many opportunities to speak with locals about the differences between their life in East Africa and ours in Australia.

As I shared with a local Christian, he asked me whether we had donkeys. When I told him that we only really have donkeys as pets, he asked me what we used to transport things around the farm and into town. I told him about our tractors, utes, and trucks... and it was soon obvious that we lived in very different worlds.

Then I talked about the clean running water in my home, and our reliable supply of electricity... not to mention our multiple flushing toilets!

Though we are all equal and precious in God's sight, not all Christians have the same wealth and 'standard' of living.

Yet, the size of a person's house or bank account does not determine their level of satisfaction and contentment. For as we experienced the singing and laughter of the Tanzanians, we saw deep joy and happiness amongst those who had far less money than us.

It was a fresh challenge for us to share our wealth with those who are in need... especially those who crave the basics of food, shelter, and education. As we travelled in Tanzania, we witnessed first-hand a number of special projects run by our friends at Anglican Aid... including schools that help protect vulnerable young girls as they face physical harm.

We were challenged afresh to share some of our wealth with those who are in great need of financial support... even though they have a satisfaction and joy that is coveted in the West.



HUMANITARIAN AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

ANGLICAN AID PROVIDES EMERGENCY RELIEF TO COMMUNITIES AFFECTED BY NATURAL DISASTERS, HEALTH EMERGENCIES AND WAR. WE WORK WITH TRUSTED CHRISTIAN ORGANISATIONS AND LOCAL CHURCHES WHO UNDERSTAND HOW TO BEST MEET THE NEEDS IN THEIR COMMUNITIES.



EAST AFRICA HUNGER APPEAL: \$280,388

In early 2023 in East Africa, communities were experiencing famine-like conditions after the worst drought in 40 years with five failed rainy seasons. Together with our long-term partners in Kenya and Ethiopia, Anglican Aid responded to the hunger crisis with life-preserving food aid, distributed by local churches in the name of Jesus.



SRI LANKA ECONOMIC CRISIS: \$27,268

In 2022, Sri Lanka suffered an economic crisis which resulted in high inflation and severe shortages of food, medicines, fuel and other essentials. Anglican Aid partnered with Anglican Relief and Development Fund Australia, the Anglican Church of Ceylon and Agape Community Healthcare Home to provide emergency supplies, medical care and income-generating support for people in need.

PAKISTAN FLOOD APPEAL: \$202,932

From June to October 2022, Pakistan suffered devastating floods. More than 1,700 people were killed and over 2 million were left homeless. Anglican Aid partnered with 1toAnother and the diocese of Hyderabad, Church of Pakistan to provide food, safe drinking water, medical supplies and tents to meet the immediate needs of those affected.

SYRIA EARTHQUAKE APPEAL: \$372,162

On 6 February 2023, a devastating earthquake struck Turkey (Türkiye) and Syria, killing over 50,000 people. Anglican Aid partnered with Damascus Church Aid to provide emergency relief including food, bedding and building supplies to the most severely affected areas in Syria.

CYCLONE FREDDY: \$86,526

In February and March 2023, Cyclone Freddy struck Southern Africa causing widespread destruction and loss of life. Anglican Aid provided emergency relief to Anglican dioceses in Mozambique, Madagascar and Malawi.

In Mozambique, 80 year-old Heide was asleep when Cyclone Freddy struck her village and tore the roof from her house. Heide's small field was also flooded and in the days after the cyclone, thieves looted her home, leaving her with no food or clothes. She said: "I was lucky to be the first person to receive a bag of rice, soap, water guard (purifier) and used clothes, which our church gave to help me and my grandson. I am grateful to the Anglican church and its partner Anglican Aid."

BUILDING THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION IN AFRICA

THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION IS A MAJOR PRIORITY FOR ANGLICAN AID. LAST YEAR WE HELPED BUILD THEOLOGICAL EDUCATION IN AFRICA THROUGH SUPPORTING THE CONSTRUCTION OF BIBLE COLLEGES, FACILITATING CURRICULUM REVIEW IN TANZANIA, SPONSORING BIBLE COLLEGE STUDENTS AND MORE.

1. TANZANIA

Last year, Anglican bishops in Tanzania asked for Anglican Aid's assistance in a conference to plan for the future of theological education in Tanzania. In March 2023, Theological Education staff of Anglican Aid, together with Bill Salier of the GAFCON Theological Educators Network, joined this gathering. The 28 attendees, including 16 bishops and 10 Bible college principals, took the opportunity to lay foundations for curriculum review and set a course that we pray will strengthen the Anglican church in Tanzania into the future.



In March, a theological education conference was held in Tanzania.

BUNDA BIBLE COLLEGE

At Bunda Bible College, 73 students were being prepared for ministry in dioceses around the country, supported through Anglican Aid. One classroom was constructed, the building of another two classrooms got underway, and there are plans to build additional accommodation.



OTHER TANZANIAN COLLEGES

At Munguishi Bible College, 24 students were supported through Anglican Aid and 25 students were supported at Lake Tanganyika Theological College.



2. SOUTH SUDAN

Renovation of student accommodation at Bishop Gwynne School of Theology started and plans were made for Anglican Aid to support major redevelopment of the Juba campus.

3. SOUTH AFRICA

Anglican Aid supported four students at George Whitefield College. We also began supporting a project to acquire books and e-books for the library as well as facilitating the digitisation of resources.





Fourteen students were supported at St Athanasius, Alexandria School of Theology.

5. CONGO

Anglican Aid is supporting the Anglican province of Congo in its theological education for both DR Congo and the Republic of Congo. Operating costs are being provided for 17 Bible colleges, educating about 450 Bible college students. A dormitory for the Bible college in Aru has been constructed and a guesthouse has been built to generate income to support the Diocese of Kindu. Construction projects are in planning for most of the other colleges.

BIBLE COLLEGE STUDENT SPONSORSHIPS: EQUIPPING GOSPEL WORKERS

BY THE END OF THE 2022-23 FINANCIAL YEAR, AUSTRALIAN CHRISTIANS WERE SPONSORING 271 STUDENTS THROUGH ANGLICAN AID'S BIBLE COLLEGE STUDENT SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM.

BUNDA BIBLE COLLEGE

At Bunda Bible College in Tanzania in 2022-23, 59 students were being prepared for ministry in dioceses around the country, supported by sponsors through Anglican Aid. The college's Principal, Canon Alpha Lugoley said as well as helping to meet students' material needs as they study, being sponsored by a Christian in a distant country like Australia is a boost to the students' faith. "They feel encouraged to work hard in the ministry wholeheartedly when they finish," said Alpha. "And being sponsored by a person who they do not know gives them something - to know the love of God is very wide. It is everywhere." Alpha said his college is deeply grateful for the support of Anglican Aid and expects the effects to have a lasting impact. "Anglican Aid is doing a great job that will be remembered here at Bunda Bible College and in the church in Tanzania."

EDUCATION: LIFTING COMMUNITIES OUT OF POVERTY

ANGLICAN AID'S EDUCATION PROJECTS ARE PROVIDING CHRISTIAN EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN IN COMMUNITIES AFFECTED BY POVERTY.

DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO: REHABILITATING SCHOOLS

The Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) is among the five poorest nations in the world. A long history of conflict and instability has left the country with limited capacity to provide basic services such as health and education. According to the World Bank, an estimated 97% of 10-yearolds in DRC experience 'learning poverty', meaning they cannot read and understand simple text.

The Anglican Church in DRC plays a vital role in educating children so they have better opportunities and can help lift the country out of poverty.

THIS IS ONE OF 24 EDUCATION PROJECTS SUPPORTED BY ANGLICAN AID ACROSS 12 COUNTRIES Anglican Aid and Openwell, UK are working together to support the Anglican Diocese of Kindu as they improve infrastructure in some of their 129 schools. In 2022, the diocese renovated four schools, a laboratory and library.

"My school has seen an increase of 188 new students this school year (2022–23) because of the rehabilitation work at the school."

RWANDA: SHYIRA PIGLET PROJECT

"What struck me was that seemingly little things can make a huge difference," said Anglican Aid project officer Hannah Grant, on returning from a visit to projects in East Africa.

One example was an income generation project being run by Shyira Diocese in Rwanda where people are given piglets. The project is entirely managed through local churches with recipients identified as people who are particularly vulnerable. Archdeacon Jean Baptiste said that recipients are encouraged to give one piglet from every litter to a needy neighbour, to share the kindness they have received.

Though the project is only about 18 months old, Hannah met families whose lives had already dramatically improved through the initiative.

One woman said that introducing pig manure as fertiliser has almost doubled her crop yields, boosting her family's income substantially. Another woman said that she was able to raise her piglets and sell them as mature animals, at a profit. The income meant she was able to buy shoes and other essentials for her children.

KENYA: GENERATE!

Anglican Aid is partnering with the Diocese of Marsabit in northern Kenya to help communities in a drought-prone region to harvest water through building infrastructure like water tanks, gutters, irrigation systems, water-storage ponds, as well as training people in small-scale crop production and on-the-job discipleship. The project helps trainees develop a Christian worldview and this has transformed people's mindsets regarding work and life.

The project was piloted at St Peter's Sagante in 2022 and has now been extended to four other churches where new tanks and guttering have been installed or existing tanks repaired to give church workers and members access to safe drinking water. Several small scale irrigation dams and tanks have also been built for crops. The project continues to be rolled out in other churches.

We praise God that the devastating drought broke in March this year and water tanks and dams are now full. We expect that the infrastructure created will build resilience against future drought and famine.

Anglican Aid has also been supporting the Diocese of Marsabit with training costs for lay church leaders for gospel ministry in partnership with CMS missionary Norm Gorrie. In the last year, over 100 leaders have been trained in ministry skills like preaching and service leading as well as biblical theology, Bible story telling and cell group leading. VALUING WOMEN: TRAINING WOMEN FOR EMPLOYMENT

ANGLICAN AID SUPPORTS PROJECTS THAT VALUE WOMEN INCLUDING CRISIS ACCOMMODATION, TRAINING FOR INCOME GENERATION AND EDUCATION FOR GIRLS.

UGANDA: MBUYU LIFE PROJECT

Katanga Slum in Kampala is home to more than 20,000 people living in crowded housing with poor sanitation. The Mbuyu Life Project lifts women from Katanga out of poverty by training them for self-employment opportunities such as catering, tailoring and jewellery making. Students also complete an adult literacy course in English as these skills are essential for starting a business.

A LIFE TRANSFORMED

Zaina had always dreamed of being able to sew and was eager to join the Skills for Life training program at Mbuyu. Mbuyu staff said that when she started, she had no confidence. She would sit quietly in a corner, covering the burns she had suffered from her violent husband, who had left her.

As Zaina, a Muslim, learned how to sew at Mbuyu, she also heard about Jesus for the first time and came to put her faith in him. She was particularly impacted when a staff member shared from the Bible about how we are all made in God's image. Even though the world might see her scars, Zaina learnt that in God's eyes, she is beautiful and valued – loved enough that Jesus died for her! Zaina doesn't hide herself anymore. She treasures her new Bible and teaches her five children about Jesus. Converting from Islam has meant she has been ostracised by some family members but she has found great joy in Jesus.

When Zaina graduated from the life skills program in April 2023, she was given a sewing machine by Mbuyu. She has started a tailoring business and can now support her family.



LOVING CHILDREN: GIVING HOPE TO LITTLE ONES

ANGLICAN AID'S PROJECTS GIVE CHILDREN LIVING IN POVERTY THE OPPORTUNITY FOR A BETTER FUTURE THROUGH EDUCATION, LIFE-SKILL TRAINING AND FAMILY SUPPORT.

SOUTH AFRICA: INTSIKA

Based in Gqeberha (formerly Port Elizabeth), Intsika runs a homework club, a school readiness program for preschoolers and a Friday afternoon kids outreach for children living in poverty.

This year, Intsika had a record number of applicants in their homework club with the centre's 52 positions filling quickly. They currently have over 40 students on the waiting list and children are still requesting registration forms! The children diligently bring in their homework - week in, week out - and work through it with the teachers, who also help them prepare for their end-of-year exams.

Michaela (below left) has a disability that means she isn't able to walk and can't go to local schools because they aren't equipped to help her. Michaela's grandmother (below right) looks after Michaela and heard about Intsika's homework club. She asked if Michaela could join while they continue looking for a school. "I have seen so much progress in her since she joined the Intsika group. She is so happy and can't wait to go every week!" said Elizabeth. "They gave her extra worksheets and alphabet cards to practise reading at home. She is so happy to be a part of the group – to her it is 'school'. I am so grateful to God."

"But more than education, we realise that the children in the community long to be a part of something...a place where they are known and loved. Even though we help them with their homework, it is truly an honour to be in a position to be that loving family to them – pointing them to our heavenly Father," said Intsika Project Manager, Laura Goosen.

Over 140 children aged 2-18 are coming to Intsika's Friday afternoon outreach where they are hearing the gospel of Jesus. Intsika also runs a more intensive discipleship group with about 10 young people coming each week. "They are so hungry to learn more about God," said Laura.

INDIA: ANUGRAH DISABILITIES

Based in Herbertpur Christian Hospital, Anugrah Disabilities provides physiotherapy, occupational therapy, early intervention programs, prosthetics and other assistive equipment.

HOPE FOR DEV

When Anugrah staff met Dev in his village in March 2019, he was two years old and fully dependent on his family. He had cerebral palsy and couldn't sit, stand, walk or play by himself. He spent his days lying on a bed at home.

With therapy from Anugrah staff, Dev learned to sit, eat by himself and stand with supportive devices. Now six years old, he is also able to name common objects and can use his hands to pick things up.

Dev's family suffered a terrible loss last year when Dev's father died. Dev's participation in programs at the Anugrah Centre during the day, has meant his mother can work as a housemaid and support the family, while Dev continues to learn and grow. She is relieved to see how her son has progressed and now has hope for his future. NOWADIA

When Nowadia was born with a cleft palate, neighbours never visited or congratulated the family. "They used to say that this child is a curse and I shouldn't breastfeed her but let her die to get out of this trouble," said Nowadia's mother. Staff from CBIDO met Nowadia last year when she was three months old, unable to feed properly and undernourished. The staff helped her mother improve her baby's feeding and arranged for her to have two rounds of surgery to address the cleft palate. Nowadia is now healing and growing well and CBIDO is following up to help with Nowadia's speech as she grows.

"May our Almighty God bless you for what you have done," said Nowadia's mother. "Thank you!"

PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS SUPPORT

ANGLICAN AID IS PROVIDING PRAYER, ADVOCACY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO CHRISTIANS SUFFERING PERSECUTION IN AFRICA AND SOUTH ASIA.

NIGERIA: SUPPORTING CHRISTIANS UNDER ATTACK

Violent persecution of Christians continues in Nigeria. In just the first four weeks of 2023, over 100 people were killed. In April, Canon Patrick Cole from the Anglican Diocese of Canberra-Goulburn visited a village which had suffered a horrific attack at the hands of Fulani Islamic tribesmen. On the night of 15 April, the tribesmen struck Runji village in Zonkwa Diocese, systematically burning houses and going from door to door killing Christian people, mainly women and children. Thirty-one homes, half the village, was burned down, 33 people were killed and 27 wounded.

Patrick visited just 10 days after the attack and said, "As we went from house to house, we heard the personal story of horrific killings, bereavement and destruction in each home ... We prayed for the Lord's comfort and healing for each villager in mourning there."

Anglican Aid has been partnering with the Diocese of Canberra-Goulburn and the Diocese of Jos to provide emergency relief to people who have lost homes and livelihoods in attacks like this.

In the last financial year, food aid, including maize and beans, was given to around 680 families who had been affected by attacks from Fulani Islamic tribesmen. This represents about 9,500 people. Local churches have been key in supporting those who have been displaced through the attacks. Praise God for the way Christians are showing Jesus' love to those in need.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The Archbishop of Sydney's Anglican Aid is the managing entity for the Archbishop of Sydney's Overseas Relief and Aid Fund and the Archbishop of Sydney's Overseas Ministry Fund.

We have presented the income and expenditure of Anglican Aid's three entities combined, as it reflects the way our three entities work together to support our partners around the world in delivering emergency aid, long-term development and ministry projects.

2022-23 was another outstanding year at Anglican Aid. Combined income for all three entities for the financial year to 30 June 2023 was \$11,133,708. This is a 38% increase in income from the previous financial year. We praise God for the faithful generosity of his people!

All program areas received increased financial support from donors. Tax-deductible donations are 78% of all income. Gospel ministry has been funded through increased non-tax-deductible donations, which are 16% of total income. Education and training (including theological education) was the purpose for our largest proportion of donations. Many donors generously responded to emergencies, particularly the Syrian earthquake disaster and East Africa hunger crisis. Anglican Aid was privileged to receive a significant bequest. Several major donors gave towards development projects and ministry activities. While the total value of donations increased, the number of individual donors also increased. It is a joy and privilege for Anglican Aid to serve alongside so many faithful supporters.

Expenditure on all projects increased in line with increased income. Total expenditure on projects, including project management, was \$7,972,128, or 72% of all income. Due to the sizable increase in income during the year, not all could be expended on projects in the same financial year. As a result, \$1,643,189 will be carried forward for future project expenditure. Operating and fundraising costs, necessary to ensure good governance, sustainability and growth, were contained to 13% of income.

Education and training was our largest area of project expenditure, at 36% of all expenditure. This is followed by emergency and development projects at 21%, which support emergency responses and a diverse range of long-term projects including support for vulnerable children, improved food security and better water supply. There has been steady growth of the tax-deductible Bible College Building Program and non-taxdeductible ministry activities.
